Brandon Country Park, near Brandon and Thetford


Travel & Parking

Access to the area is from the B1106. Take the Mayday Bird Hide turning a few km south of Brandon, as shown here



From here the event will be signed along forest tracks for a about 2km to the parking. It is also possible to walk from Brandon station - please contact the organiser if you plan to do this.

Facilities

Registration, download, St John's ambulance and two toilets will be located in the assembly area.

Start

The start is about 1.5km along flat tracks from the assembly area.

Finish

The finish is about 300m from the assembly area. Water will be provided at the finish.

There will be a string course on both days

SI Punching

Both days will be using SI electronic punching. SI cards will be available to hire for 50p.

Start Times

10:30am - 12:30pm

Courses will close at 2:45pm

Start times will be available, when allocated, on the Fabian4 website. We are using 15 minute start blocks rather than individual start times. The time shown on Fabian4 is the start of each 15 minute block (e.g. if your start time is shown as 11:15 your start block is from 11:15 to 11:29). You may start at any available time, but priority will be given to those competitors who have been allocated to the current start block. There will be a 3 minute call-up.

Control Descriptions

Loose control descriptions for orange to black will be available in the start lanes at -3 minutes, with both symbol and written descriptions for the orange course.

Loose descriptions (symbol and written) for white and yellow will be available at the pre-start, along with their maps.

Symbol control descriptions for all courses will be printed on the map, on the back for white to brown and on the front for black.

Map

The area is Brandon Country Park. Minor updates have been made for the event.

Maps will be printed on A4 waterproof paper.

White to brown will be at 1:10000, and black at 1:15000.

Special symbols used include: thick green line – rootstock wall, green dot – holly bush.

Out of bounds is shown with purple hatching.

Legends will be available at registration and are not on the map.

Maps for the white and yellow courses will be available at the pre-start.

Terrain

Brandon Country Park consists of mature deciduous woodland surrounding a country house, extending into managed coniferous forest, including one area of surprising contour detail.

Safety

You take part in this event at your own risk and are responsible for your own safety. You are advised to carry a whistle. You must report to the download station, even if you do not complete your course. Full leg cover (i.e. no shorts) is compulsory.

The area is used by cyclists and also as a husky dog training area, so please take care when crossing tracks.

St John's ambulance will be located in the assembly area.

Dogs

Dogs are welcome on both days but must be kept on leads.

Results

Interim results will be displayed near the download tent.

Full results will be posted on the CUOC website (www.cuoc.org.uk) soon after the event.

Icenian Trophy

To keep things simple, the Icenian trophy will be awarded to the club which has the lowest score when the positions of their top ten placed runners are added. (A minimum of ten runners is required). Results from each course will be counted together (even if competitors are in different age classes).

Cancellation Policy

In the event of extreme weather, a decision may be made to cancel. In this case a notice would be posted on the CUOC website (www.cuoc.org.uk) at the earliest possible opportunity. CUOC reserve the right to retain all or part of the entry fee to cover costs already incurred.
