Since the last time, the <u>SMILE summer league</u> has now started and is well underway, with four events having taken place on Coe Fen, in Milton Country Park, Bedford Park and Rowney Wood. I've included results of the events as well as reports from the organising family juniors... It's been great to see so many juniors out and enjoying themselves, lots of them running several (or in some cases all) of the courses on offer. The SMILE events still to come are at Amtphill Park (7th June), Hinchingbrooke Park (28th June), Therfield Heath (6th July) and Fairlands Valley (20th July – don't forget this is also) – hope to see many of you there too!

It was great to see so many of you competing at the \underline{JK} - many of you having had very good runs on the individual days and were still ready and up for running in a number of teams in the relays: we've had plenty of 'Junior Jabbers' teams! Some of the especially good results were here:

- Thomas Louth (M10A) 7th overall
- Alice Campbell (W10A) 5th on both days and overall (with a Championships time)
- Katrin Sengerova (W12B) 4th on day 1
- Jamie Taylor (M14A) 10th overall, with being 6th on day 2 and having Championships times on both days
- Helen Gardner (W18A) 5th overall

Only a few weekends ago, several WAOC juniors took part in the <u>British Champs</u>, held near Sheffield this year. Congratulations to **Thomas Louth** who came 3^{rd} on the M10A (with a Championships time), as well as...

- Edward Louth (M14A) 8th with a Champs time
- Jamie Taylor (M14A) 10th with a Champs time

And of course everyone else who was there.

Congratulations once again to **Helen Gardner**, who made a trip to Scotland on the May Day Bank Holiday weekend to compete in the Future Champions Cup final, which consisted of a short race on the Saturday and the classic race on the Sunday. Helen finished 4th out of the W18s in the short race and then did brilliantly in the classic to finish 2nd; overall this meant that in the combined results of W18s and W20s, Helen finished in 3rd place, coming 2nd out of the W18s. On the basis of her results, **Helen has been selected to run in the JWOC** in Estonia this July, as well as for the pre-JWOC 2004 training tour to Russia. Congratulations!

Meanwhile, EA juniors have been busy with selection races for summer training tours – from WAOC, well done to **Jamie Taylor** who has been selected as the region's representative for the Lagganlia summer training camp. Undoubtedly you'll read lots about what the juniors have been up to in the editions of Junior Jabber to follow.

EA Schools Championships, Hatfield Forest, 22^{nd} June 2003

This is just to remind you that the EA schools Championships are going to be held as part of the SOS colour coded event at Hatfield Forest on the 22^{nd} June. Your school does not necessarily have to be going for you to be able to attend and run the event – you will still be eligible for individual trophies. In order to have a year-group team, you must have three individuals from that year-group, for a school team there must be at least 4 scoring individuals. If you are running, the courses that you are expected are as follows, depending on your year-group:

- Primary School juniors run the white course
- Year 7&8 juniors run the yellow course
- Year 9&10 juniors run the orange course
- Year 11, 12, 13 run the light green course

Some of the WAOC juniors have done very well in last year's event, despite it being held during half-term at an inconvenient time. So it would be nice to see a number of you there at the event. More details about where the event is can be found on <u>http://stragglers.info/event/20030622.htm</u>.

3 – Bedford Park, 11th May

Report by the collective organisers and planners, Katrina (W11), Jamie (M14), Helen and Adrian Taylor...

In the 3rd SMILE event of the summer, over 40 children and adults made the most of the Bedford sunshine and galloped around the park. The usually courses, white (1.6km), Yellow, (2.4km) and Orange (3km), and a 30 minute score event, with starts from 11-12.++ provided lots of opportunities to test navigation skills. Many children did more than one course as confidence grew, and went home with a certificate and badge for their efforts.

For the older people, a tight 30 minute deadline was set for a score event with points awarded for each control visited. Peter (M18), Simon (M16) and Helen (W18) Gardner, and Steve Lawson got to all 28 controls to score a maximum 320 points, just. Peter even managed to visit them all again (in numerical order) in 45 mins, while Helen (W18) also demonstrated her commitment to performing at the highest level in the more competitive side of orienteering by doing some hill training up the side of the cemetery; there are no hills in Cambridge.

On the downside, 3 controls disappeared with no trace, no doubt causing some competitors to lose time searching.

Finally, thanks to all who turned up, and made all the effort in planning and organising the event worthwhile. We hope to see some newcomers again at another WAOC event.
